Anthropology Critical analysis essay

Anthropology refers to the study of the ways of life of a people with a view of explaining why they do their things the way they do. The study of anthropology, therefore, has the primary objective of enabling one to understand culture and cultural practices of a particular community. According to Sahlin, there are three major forms of reciprocity that one can use to further the butter trade. The three forms of reciprocity include generalized, symmetrical and negative reciprocity. Sahlins is known

to advance the debate on the relationship between social relationships and reciprocity. Sahlins further presents a set of premises that establish the tripartite relationship between morality, social relations and reciprocity. In some instances, altering a transaction can be a social blunder and negatively affect a social relationship.

The holistic approaches to jokes can also be discussed in the context of anthropology. The essence of a joke is to make fun of something or to just tickle people and enable them to be happy. A joke can at times be hidden in the culture and the skits that are exclusive to a particular culture that requires one to understand a culture to grasp the joke that is presented by one. The understanding of one's culture enables one to avoid the blonde moments that one might have when a joke is made.

Jokes are often presented in cartoons. The cartoons are many a times jokes that are primarily relevant to a particular culture. For example an American cartoon is many a times different from a Chinese or a Japanese cartoon owing to the stark differences in the two cultures. The wordings from the banking officer and the pictorial presentation in the cartoon depict a stark and clear difference on the status of the financial system of the United States of America. The next three paragraphs present an annotation of the cartoon that is presented above.

To begin with, the pictorial presentation of the banking officer having the head of a shark and the background pictorial of small fish depicts the economic state of the United States of America from the view of an anthropologist. The economic situation of the American people depict the banking system is fleeing the public. The picture of the banking officer having the head of a shark is a joke that the author of the cartoon uses to establish that the banking officers in the United States have the nature of their dealings more as animals that humans.

Second, on the left side of the picture is a window that shows the high-rise buildings. As such, the angling or the gradient that the office of the banking officer is seems to be relatively higher or at par with the high rise buildings within the vicinity. The joke that the cartoon further

presents is the relation of the sharks and the heights. The presentation of the heights, fish and the sharks causes laughter on the impossible existence of the sharks on the higher altitudes. The inability of the sharks to live on land depicts that the banks have to direct relationship with the people who they seek to represent in their economic interests.

The other joke that is present is the presence of the stationery that is placed on the table. There are stacks of paper that are on the table with the modern technology that are available on the cartoon being mainly the phone and the cell phone that the banking officer uses. The joke that is the said aspect of the cartoon asserts that the banks have to relation to the current trends that are there in the United States of America. The ability to comprehend the understanding of the cartoon requires one to analyze the culture of the Americans, particularly in regard to their financial behavior. The culture of the Americans establishes that the Banks are the main support system that they have in their quest for economic growth. Americans main thrive in debts thus the depiction of the banks and the banking officers having the shapes of sharks owing to the nature of their dealings within the society.

Critical analyses of the premises that are postulated in the course material depict the application of the course in the cultural and economic anthropology. The understanding of the course material further establish that for one to understand the various aspects of belief and traditional aspects of various populations and people speaking groups, one needs to know how the community relate and their usual practices.
